SUBJECT: Changes to the Faculty Handbook

Substantial changes to the *Faculty Handbook* were approved by the Board of Trustees on June 26, 2015. The document linked <u>here</u> was presented to the Board of Trustees includes 13 changes to the *Faculty Handbook* with brief explanations for each change. All of the changes came as recommendations from the Faculty Senate and were approved by Interim Provost Stan Aeschleman. I am pleased to share the changes with the faculty.

I encourage you to review all of the changes. The most significant changes for faculty rights and privileges include these: Item 3 that makes explicit the right of faculty members to have observers at employment-related meetings (pp. 5-9); Item 4 that clarifies that promotion to Associate Professor with tenure one year before the mandatory year requires exceptional performance (p. 9); Item 6 that allows only graduate faculty and affiliate graduate faculty to vote on graduate programs and curriculum (pp. 10-11); Item 7 that makes changes to the post-tenure review policy in light of policy changes by the UNC Board of Governors (pp. 11-13); Item 8 that improves 4.10 Discharge or the Imposition of Serious Sanction (p. 14); Item 9 on Faculty Senate reviews of administrators modifies language to reflect current practices including evaluation of deans (pp. 14-17); Items 11 and 12 that create a Graduate Academic Policies and Procedures Committee and make needed changes to the Undergraduate Academic Policies and Procedures Committee (pp. 18-21.) Item 13 is an updated Chapter VIII Employee Benefits and Services (pp. 22-32.)

Implementation

We plan to have the revised *Faculty Handbook* for 2015-2016 available by the middle of August as well as guidelines and "frequently asked questions" to help with the implementation of the *Handbook* changes. As we implement the changes in this upcoming year, Academic Affairs will consult with deans, department chairs, and Faculty Senate, and we would welcome suggestions.

All materials pertaining to these *Handbook* changes will be announced to faculty and posted on the Academic Affairs website as they become available.
